## Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out

T4 Sycamore - remove the lowest 2 branches overhanging the garage at 6 Park Road along with the lowest branches on the chapel side and reduce any branches away from the chapel to give 2 metres clearance.

Crown reduce the branches overhanging the garage and garden of 6 Park Road by 4 metres to give more light and reduce future issues of branches snapping and reduce the amount of honeydew that drips on the cars.

The trees have grown extremely large and although apparently in good health their size and physical dominance of the area gives some cause for concern. Hopefully with good pruning the trees can be slowly reduced in size while being retained for many years to come.

T3 Cherry - Reduce the large limb overhanging the garage by 5 metres. Crown reduce the remaining branches by 4 metres to allow more light to the neighbouring properties and reduce the risk of limbs snapping and falling on the garage.

G2 Conifers - Group of mixed conifers that are getting too wide and obstructing the drive and path. Trim back and reduce in height to maintain.

T5 Conifer growing close to the wall. There are concerns it might start affecting the wall. crown lift to remove branches away from the wall and driveway. trim to maintain.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

- indicate the main features of the site where the tree(s) stand and its surroundings; in particular, you should:
  - mark and name surrounding roads
  - sketch in buildings, including adjoining properties
  - add house numbers or names
- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
  - marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
  - showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
  - adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
