Good Afternoon

Thank you for your application.

On the application form, it is stated that the Weeping Ash tree in question is to have some branches trimmed. Please could you provide an approximate measurement in feet or metres as to the amount the crown is to be reduced by (alternatively, this can be illustrated on photographs with a line depicting where the crown is to be reduced to).

On the application form, you have ticked 'No' to ownership and have given the name of the property. Please could you provide the name of the owner and their address as they will need to be consulted before any works can go ahead.

On the application form, you have ticked 'Yes' to the section "Alleged damage to property - e.g. subsidence or damage to drains or drives". Due to the tree being covered by a Tree Preservation Order, the application form states:

" If YES, you are required to provide for:

Subsidence - A report by an engineer or surveyor to include a description of damage, vegetation, monitoring data, soils, roots and repair proposals. Also, a report from and arboriculturist to support tree work proposals.

Other structural damage (e.g. drains, walls and hard surfaces) - Written technical evidence from an appropriate expert, including description of damage and possible solutions".

However, if you have ticked 'Yes' to the section "Alleged damage to property" only in relation to windows and gutters being hit by the branches of the Ash tree, then this section would not be relevant to your application. If this is the case, please confirm. If this is not the case, please provide the information as required above that is relevant to your application.
