Tree and vegetation pruning to areas indicated on the attached plan.

It is recommended that any overhanging vegetation to the rear and side of the store be cut back. The area of waste ground adjacent to the stores location is providing cover for foraging rodents to live and forage in. By removing overhanging branches this will reduce the risk of rodents climbing into the rear yard from this area. Also some of the signage was covered by vegetation. Removal would make this more visible.

The site has been split into 5 areas identified with numbers that correspond to the following works. Our certified team will attend site and in accordance with the attached plan and photographs carry out the following works. Area 1 - Sycamore and ash growing over fence from neighbouring property - With the use of a pole saw cut back the limbs to the fence line to a height of 3.75m. Area 2 - Buddleia growing over fence from neighbouring property - With a pole saw cut back the overhanging branches to the fence line to full height of buddleia. Area 3 - Buddleia at side of building - With the use of a chainsaw cut down the buddleia to ground level, then treat the stumps with glyphosate to help prevent regrowth. Area 4 - Elder growing over fence - With pole saw cut back overhanging branches to the fence line. Area 5 - Buddleia along rear of the store covering signage. With the use of a chainsaw fell the buddleia to ground level and treat the stumps with glyphosate to help prevent regrowth.
