The County Council's StatementPART I

The following drawing and document are submitted to illustrate the County Council's statement:-

1. A 6" to 1 mile map which shows the appeal site, the village of Skellingthorpe and the sites of applications previously determined by the County Council. (Map "A").
2. A schedule of decisions taken in the Old Wood, Skellingthorpe. (Appendix "A").

PART II.The application and its determination.

1. The application, the subject of this appeal, was submitted by Mr. E. J. Miles on 11th June, 1963. The description of the proposed development given was "erection of bungalow".
2. The County Council, in April, 1961, adopted a system of delegation of their powers under Part III of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1947. The County Planning Officer considers an application under the terms of the delegation agreement to ascertain whether the application is excepted

village have been allocated for residential development in the Lincoln Fringe Town Map which has been approved by the County Council and submitted to the Minister. It is expected that these areas will be developed when main drainage is provided in the next 18 months or so. These facilities are not to be provided in the Skellingthorpe Old Wood.

6. Skellingthorpe Old Wood is a considerable area of woodland lying approximately half a mile to the west and north west of the village on a gravel subsoil of poor agricultural quality. Considerable areas of the Old Wood were cleared during the first world war. These areas are now scrub woodland and prior to the advent of planning control a number of shacks, caravans, old bus bodies and a few more permanent dwellings become established in clearings. A large part of the wood is now Forestry Commission property.

7. Nearly all of this sub-standard development has taken place fronting onto a doglegged woodland track which leads in a north westerly direction into the wood for 2,000 feet from the end of the road from Skellingthorpe village and then turns north west for another 5,000 feet to join the Saxilby Road. Various portions of this woodland track have been patched from time to time and the Forestry Commission, some years back, laid down a hardcore and ash surface to facilitate the passage of vehicles to the afforested area. The track is, however, in a very unsatisfactory condition and it is not practicable to drive a car right through from Skellingthorpe to the Saxilby Road either in summer, when

11. The local planning authority consider that to permit further dwellings of any sort will increase the pressure for further public services, including main drainage, and above all for the improvement of the road facilities in the Old Wood at considerable public expense. Accordingly the County Council request the Minister to dismiss the appeal.
