Design Access and Heritage Statement

No 3 Grove Mews is within the curtilage of The Grove, a Grade 2 listed building (List Entry No:1268988) in part dating back to 16th Century'

Each of the properties within this curtilage have been subject to more recent alteration including the use of Upvc windows and doors.

A previous application DC/14/2525/LBC was submitted in August 2014 for the replacement of the large Garden room/Conservatory located to the rear of this property and was subsequently permitted. The conservatory we are proposing to replace has been in situ well in excess of ten years and is already White Upvc in construction. This is directly adjacent to one end of this previously permitted application

The proposal is to renew this old white Upvc conservatory (retaining existing brickwork) with a new white Upvc one that is identical to the existing in size and design with the exception of the roof glazing which is proposed to be glass as opposed to polycarbonate to match with the previous garden room replacement.

The new conservatory will be superior in performance to the old product and the introduction of glazing to the roof as opposed to the existing polycarbonate will enhance the aesthetic.

Access will be unaltered by this proposal

The listed building is of some importance incorporating an early core. That said, this site is well concealed, both from the public highway and the core part of the listed site.

This is a modest proposal with no public impact and does not impact on the property adversely
