We have had a survey carried out by an arborist (tree surgeon) who has advised the following:

Oak tree (T1) at front of house - T1 front oak tree to be pollarded to previous pruning points to keep the tree maintained and at a reasonable size for the garden

.

Oak tree (T2) at rear of house - T2 rear oak to have a side crown reduction. To establish 2 meter drip line away from the main residence property. To reduce the risk of damage to our home and improve light levels in and around our home.

We would like to mention that directly in front of our home in our neighbour's garden there are four large oak trees which significantly reduced light levels in our main front garden.

Also, in the rear garden the very large oak tree (T2) is weighted heavily towards and over the rear roof of our home, all of our bedrooms are directly underneath and we are concerned with the large branches that have come down in recent adverse weather including very strong winds

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
