My understanding is that the larch and a pine tree in my back garden are covered by a TPO. Both trees are now very tall and I am concerned that very strong winds could cause one or both of them to fall and cause considerable damage.

I am particularly concerned about the larch which is quite close to my house.

On occasion we have had whole branches break and fall into the garden. Luckily no one has been in the garden at times when this has happened but it does worry me that a falling branch could hurt someone. Additionally the length of the larch's branches means that means that one of them is now getting very close to a back bedroom window of our house and at least one branch is now starting to grow over into my neighbour's garden. The height of the larch means that neither me nor my neighbour can reach the branches to cut them back.

At least one branch of the larch is dead but it is currently being prevented from falling into the garden by another branch.

As well as the worry about the height of the larch and the length of the larch's branches, I am concerned that the larch's root system may also be starting to cause some disturbance in my garden. The patio slabs closest to the larch are starting to push upwards meaning the patio is no longer flat and I am concerned that just replacing the patio slabs will not solve this problem as the growth from the larch will again dislodge any new patio slabs.

Therefore I have several concerns about the larch and I would like permission to fell it even though I know it is a healthy tree.

I would ideally like to also fell the pine tree that is very close to my neighbour's boundary. When it is windy the pine tree really does sway and "creak". I would prefer to fell it rather than have it fall. As it is very tall, if it fell it could cause considerable damage.
