Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

Please identify the tree(s) and provide a full and clear specification of the works you want to carry out

T1 - Holly Tree - Reduce by 2-3m overall, Tree has become to big for its position by the shared driveway to other Houses. It also seems to be sparse in leaf coverage and struggling toi feed it's present canopy probably due to ground compression issues. Reduce so not so much canopy to feed.

T2 - Holly Tree - Reduce by 1m-15m all round to tidy and contain, purely for cosmetic reasons, as it is a focal point in the middle of the rear garden.

T3/4/5 - Fell 3 Holly Stems rubbing on the roadside fence. Stems are physically rubbing on the fence causing damage to the panels, the boundary is full of Trees and removing these 3 would go unnoticed by the general public.

Trimming back other smaller lateral branches on other Holly Trees that rub on the fence to give clearance.

T6 - Holly Tree - Can only be viewed from the opposite side of the road. Tree is to the left of the spinney as viewed from the road and this Holly sticks up way above the rest of the canopies, it has a unreasonable amount of deadwood in the top. Remove deadwood and reduce remainder of Tree back in line with the rest of the Hollies (approx 3-4m off height).

T7 - Acacia Tree - Tree is rubbing badly on roadside fence causing damage to fence and Tree, fell Tree to ground level, to avoid further damage as no other reduction options are available.

T8 - Oak Tree - deadwood over Road. Tree has a large amount of deadwood , remove to stop any falling in road.

T9 - Sweet Chestnut Tree - Remove deadwood for safety.

T10 - Acacia - situated behind T8, remove deadwood for safety.

T11 - Holly Trees - reduce branches to give 1-1.5m clearance from Garage, branches are currently rubbing on roof and guttering.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
