T1- Eucalyptus - located to the rear of the property, tree to have 2 North facing multi limbs that overhang the fence removed, and the top reduced back in line with the fence. This work is to be carried out to reduce risk of damage to the boundary fence.

T2- Cotoneaster - located in the corner of the neighbouring garden, Cotoneaster to be reduced back in line with the fence on the northern side by 1m and shaped to maintain a natural appearance. This is to be carried out as the tree has outgrown its natural boundary while maintaining, just cutting it back to the fence would leave the tree with an unnatural appearance.

T3- Pittosporum- Located next to the Eucalyptus, Pittosporum to be reduced back in line with the fence by cutting back the northern side by 30-40cms. The Pittosporum has outgrown its boundaries it resides in and needs to be cut back in a natural shape to maintain its appearance.

Stump 1 and 2 located at the front of property also to be ground out.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
  - o marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
  - o showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
  - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
