## LIGHTING ASSESSMENT


Guidance for Site Management of existing and new external lighting.

All domestic lighting within the dwelling shall be contained at window and door locations by using curtains to limit the exposure within the night sky outside of normal daylight hours.

Where external lighting is existing or maintained this should be limited to one light per elevation only and located on the building between ground level and first floor level to avoid a wide disbursal of light. Infrared Sensors should be provided to limit the duration of external lighting usage and also limit the field of vision so that wildlife is not affected by such devices.

New ramp to have discrete low level lights to give subtle lighting along the access to the front door.

The South Downs National Park has been designated an International Dark Sky Place since 2016;
