WASTE MANAGEMENT STATEMENT

Guidance for Site Management of existing and new external lighting.

Where possible, local recycling centres will be used for packaging materials including paper, cardboard, plastics, Metal and timber.

Timber Pallets can be recycled unless damaged –using Pallet Recycling Te [REDACTED] based in Reading and Basingstoke.

Builders waste can be removed from site by Skip using TJWASTE based at Fareham –which then gets sorted and recycled T [REDACTED] Alternatively Williams of Bordon also offer removal of excavated soil waste for recycling. Tel: [REDACTED]

By using local trades the carbon footprint of Builder travelling to site can be kept to a minimum level and this philosophy is at the heart of selecting local tradesmen.

Just in Time deliveries will be used as much as is possible to reduce the number of repeat journey to and from site.

Electric hand tools shall be used during the work period which will also be during day light hours ONLY to avoid the need for task lighting and reducing the noise, air and light pollution as much as possible.

Cleaving of bricks and blockwork will be undertaken when possible but if materials are required to be diamond cut, harvested rain water shall be used to reduce the dust emissions –being mindful also of the time of day that such operations are carried out –to avoid noise nuisance and pollution.

Fresh tap water will be used sparingly for site mortar using an electric motor driven mixing machine.

Control of Substances Hazardous to Health (COSHH) Data sheets shall be made available on site for all materials to ensure that all operatives are aware of the measure to be taken when working on site with ALL building materials.

Disposal of all materials that are a hazardous to health should be discussed with the local recycling centre or Local Authority for clarity on how to deal with such materials. See contact list above.
