- Nesting birds are protected under the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 (as amended);
  therefore, building demolition should take place outside the breeding season (March to August inclusive) unless carefully checked beforehand by a suitably qualified person.
- All bat species are legally protected under the Wildlife & Countryside Act 1981 (as amended); as such, trees to be removed will require inspection for suitable features that could be used by roosting bats prior to felling. This can be carried out by the arborist completing the works, however if suitable roosting features are identified, evidence of bats, or indeed live bats are found, works should cease, and advice obtained from a licenced bat ecologist.
