

Heritage Statement

1. 5224 SHERBORNE STREET (north-west side) The Duke of Wellington Public House SP 1620 NE 3/23

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2. Early C18 and early C19, altered circa 1900. Coursed rubble, partly rendered and painted, Cotswold stone roof. Two storeys. Two light mullioned casement windows, and sashes, some with glazing bars. Two storey bay with sash windows a later addition. Mid-late C19. 2½ storey, 2 window extension to north-east. Long extensions to rear with a closing wing.

Listing NGR: SP1668220668

Whilst designing our proposed signage scheme, we were keenly aware of the history of this site and its prominence within the wider street scene. As a result, we opted to design a like for like scheme in terms of signage locations with additional new signage, with a darker redecoration colour to enhance the appearance of the site.

We have tried to replicate the existing sign sizes where possible as the existing signs are scaled perfectly for the building to accommodate, without them becoming overbearing.

Where we have positioned the lighting will allow the key architectural features of the building to be highlighted without dominating the street scene.

Overall, we feel that our proposed scheme is sympathetic and will enhance/protect the building for many years to come.
