At 9 metres on the north side, just below the point of failure are two brackets of Inonotus hispidus, and a woodpecker hole at the same height on the east face. Each major crown part has been subject to a major reduction, and has formed a new crown from the regrowth. This likely happened as a response to the major failure. The upper crown is very likely in poor condition, and further assessment by climbing inspection is recommended. March 2024 Update: A climbing inspection has been completely which confirmed good reaction wood around the historic failure of the main stem. The condition of the stem below this in the region of the woodpecker hole and fungal bracket is poor, leaving the specimen predisposed to
