Dear Development Management Team,

Please see attached arboricultural survey. The works applied for are the recommendations from this survey. I have also applied for two recommendations of my own that I believe should have been picked up in the survey but weren't. These are T28: Beech - Thin out heavy limb to northwest by 20% to reduce sail effect and resultant force on compromised union - this is a very heavy limb with a significant debarked area at its union with the trunk. Cobra braces have previously been installed but crown thinning this limb was recommended to reduce lateral forces from wind as well as weight.

T29: Poplar - Remove deadwood and broken branches, canopy-lift to 5m (no reduction to height or spread) - Deadwood/ broken branches present, lower branches will inevitably be removed in time so recommend removing now to minimise pruning wound size.

Regarding the trees not subject to tpos, I will submit another application.
