One sycamore with 4 trunks sitting within the hedgerow requires pollarding to make safe from falling rotten and possibly infected branches at

One sycamore with 4 trunks sitting within the hedgerow requires pollarding to make safe from falling rotten and possibly infected branches at approximately 40 ft height. A tree surgeon has removed dangerous branches by cutting back by less than 15% in line with BS3998, however, he has advised that further reduction to within 4ft of ground level because the base of the trees is showing signs of rot from poor previous work. (This poor cutting work was completed approximately 20+ years ago.) Large branches currently overhang into the neighbouring property at the rear may also need removing to ensure that there is the garden is safe from falling branches. The hedgerow shows signs of rot but the tree surgeon has advised that it could be replanted with native species to bring it back to a thriving and manageable Cornish hedge. In addition, a holly tree to the height of 30 ft requires removal to ensure that a pathway for pedestrian access to a neighbouring property (as determined with the title deeds) is reinstated into the curtilage of 27 New Cottages (the applicant).

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
 - o marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
 - o showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
 - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
