I am keen to get this resolved

The pine tree currently touches the house. We would like to prune lateral branches so it is 2.2m away from house. This leaves a branch length of 4.8m
We want to remove the odd growing branch as highlighted in the report shared
Canopy lift to 4.8m

For the neighbours tree
Canopy lift to 4.8m

Branches touching house so prune lateral so 3m away from house. This leaves a branch length of various length as many branches (2-5m)

I need more detail than “a little lateral pruning”. The description I usually send is below, essentially, how far away from the house will the end of the pruned branches be please?

Selective Crown Reduction - The location of that part of the crown should be described and the amount of the reduction proposed should be stated in terms of the intended remaining length of the limb/branch after pruning or by the proposed distance between any structure and the end of the pruned branch.
