Process and Specialisation Area - The Contractor shall refer to the Arboricultural Method Statements, to ensure protection of the site. The Contractor is to identify the risks and type of work, shown on the drawings and prepare adequate method statements for dealing with those risks identified, including but not limited to:

- Excavation (particularly in relation to trees/habitat,
- Working from height,
- Hazardous materials,
- Heavy or bulky materials/objects,
- Welfare facilities.

Sequence of Works - The Contractor is to prepare a sequence of works based upon the proposals, detailing what steps employees will take to complete the process.

Supervisory/Monitoring Arrangements - The Contractor is to put in place arrangements to demonstrate how each one contributes to the job proceeding safely and state safety contracts and emergency procedures.

Schedule of Plant - The Contractor is to identify dangerous equipment and detail a safety plan with control measures outlined.

Occupational Health Standards - The Contractor is to have in place a standard operating set of procedures in relation to health and safety concerns, including but not limited to:

- Exposure to chemicals.
- Emissions.
- Loud noises,
- Stress.
- Fatigue.

First Aid Procedures - The Contractor is to have in place as part of their method statements, first aid procedures to identify the health and safety contracts on-site to ensure the Health and safety of the entire team.

Personal Protective Equipment - The Contractor is to prepare as part of their method statements, list of all site operatives including self-employed, including the PPE required for every person.

Arrangements for Demarcation - The Contractor is to demarcate the boundary limits for the project to ensure control measures are in place for everything within that area.

Third Party Safety Controls - The Contractor is to identify any neighbouring properties which can be affected by the work and prepare H&S precautions to ensure their welfare.

Emergency Procedures - The Contractor is responsible for including in their method statements, any control measures necessary should there be an emergency on-site.
