



THE KINGS HEAD, GREAT CORNARD

HERITAGE & DESIGN STATEMENT

GRADE II LISTED – ENTRY NUMBER 1351761

The Kings Head public house sits on Bures Road in Great Cornard just outside of Sudbury. The Grade II listed building is an 18th century, two storey timber framed building with double hung window sashes to the ground floor and leaded casement windows to the first floor. On the front elevation there are two six-panel doors with plain pilasters and cornice and a gabled wing projects at the rear. The roof is tiled with cut and shaped fascia boards.

The proposals are to remove 2No fascia signs and the Greene King crown and arrows and to replace with sign-written pub name fascia signs.

Removing the crown and arrows makes the building façade less cluttered and goes some way towards de-branding the site as Greene King. This is a tenanted property and therefore needs to look more like an independent establishment. Likewise, for removing the bulky green fascia boards and introducing a much more subtle hand written name sign. All the existing lighting remains the same. We feel that these small changes better reflect the operation and enhance rather than detract from the building itself.
