Surface Water Services

The applicant should demonstrate to your LPA that its prospective surface run-off will discharge as high up the hierarchy of drainage options as is reasonably practicable (with evidence that the Run-off Destination Hierarchy has been addressed, and reasoning as to why any preferred disposal route is not reasonably practicable):

- 1. Water re-use (smart water butts, rainwater harvesting, grey flushing toilets)
- 2. Discharge into the ground (infiltration); or where not reasonably practicable,
- 3. Discharge to a surface waterbody; or where not reasonably practicable,
- 4. Discharge to a surface water sewer, highway drain, or another drainage system; or where not reasonably practicable,
- Discharge to a combined sewer. (Subject to Sewerage Undertaker carrying out capacity evaluation)
