Identification of Tree(s) and Description of Works

We asked our tree surgeon to look at some trees in our garden. They are covvered in a TPO as 'wooded area'.

These are his thoughts:

- -Three Fagus sylvatica that grew from a hedge on the east side of the rear garden. They are twisted and could become dangerous if allowed to continue growing.
- -A further Fagus sylvatica on the east boundary of the back garden. This has a split in the bark all the way up the trunk, it is probably dying and therefore may become dangerous
- -A Cupressus app on the east boundary of the back garden also appears to be in poor health. There is extensive damage to the branches on its western aspect, possibly due to damage from a fire before we owned the house. Also it is dropping entire branches over its full height. It is also probably dying and may become dangeerous.
- -A Crateagus crus-galli in the lawn is dropping a lot of twigs, had very sparse flowers and is possibly dying as well.

We are unhappy about needing to fell so many large trees but understand the reasoning behind the tree surgeon's advice. We have a field adjoining our garden; we have planted an orchard there. Although we may not live to see it mature, we will, to some extent be mitigating the loss of so many trees in our garden.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.

## Sketch plan requirements

Your plan needs to show the precise location of the tree(s) in relation to nearby property/roads/boundaries. It should, therefore:

- indicate the main features of the site where the tree(s) stand and its surroundings; in particular, you should:
  - mark and name surrounding roads
  - sketch in buildings, including adjoining properties
  - o add house numbers or names
- mark the position of the tree(s) to which you want to carry out work and identify them by the number shown in the Tree Preservation Order where possible; if you use a different number, please make sure that this can be matched with your description of the tree(s)
- if there are many trees on the site, make clear which tree(s) are included in this application by:
  - marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
  - o showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
  - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)

If it is impossible to identify the tree(s) accurately on the plan (e.g. because they are part of a woodland or group of trees), please identify their approximate location on the plan and provide details of how the tree(s) are marked on site (e.g. high visibility tape, tree tags, paint, etc); trees must not be marked by scarring or cutting into the bark.
