A large number of trees onsite are protected by TPO 355. A separate application for works to those trees has been submitted. This application covers trees that are not covered by the TPO.

Numbering refers to areas specified in Hebden Arboriculture QTRA report (attached):

Car Park

- G1 – Mixed species inc. Pine, Field maple, wild cherry

Crown reduction to allow 1m clearance around car park lights (for safety reasons), Crown lift to 2.5m over parking spaces to ensure no injury to persons or damage to vehicles.

- G2 - Mixed species including Pine, field maple, wild cherry

Crown reduction to allow 1m clearance around car park lights (for safety reasons), Crown lift to 2.5m over parking spaces to ensure no injury to persons or damage to vehicles. Crown lift of Pine to 3m to allow clearance above car parking spaces and unrestricted views of car park.

- G3 Mixed species inc. wild cherry

Crown reduction to allow 1m clearance around car park lights (for safety reasons), Crown lift to 2.5m over parking spaces to ensure no injury to persons or damage to vehicles.

- G4 Mixed species inc. wild cherry

Remove low branch over shed, Prune 1m clear of BT line.

- G5 – Dogwood

Coppice large dogwood to prevent obstruction of car park lighting.

G7 Walled Garden

- Willow in Walled garden

Fell Willow in Walled Garden to ground level. The willow is in poor condition, is reducing light and borrowed views of the beautiful Cypress behind. It is unlikely that a replacement tree will be planted here as the garden is small and already contains lots of other trees.

G4 Service Yard

Works not specified in Arboricultural report:

- Cherry trees x2

Prune back Cherry trees to ensure branches do not overhang neighbouring road (lateral prune by approx 1.5m). Removal of two lower branches to allow shipping container to be manoeuvred into place. Crown reduction by approx 2m.

G6 Courtyard Garden

- Young copper beech (planted 2018)

Height reduction of young copper beech x3 in Courtyard Garden by 1.2m. Maintenance to ensure trees don't outgrow their space and allow annual maintenance as a hedge to take place by staff gardener.

You might find it useful to contact an arborist (tree surgeon) for help with defining appropriate work.
