

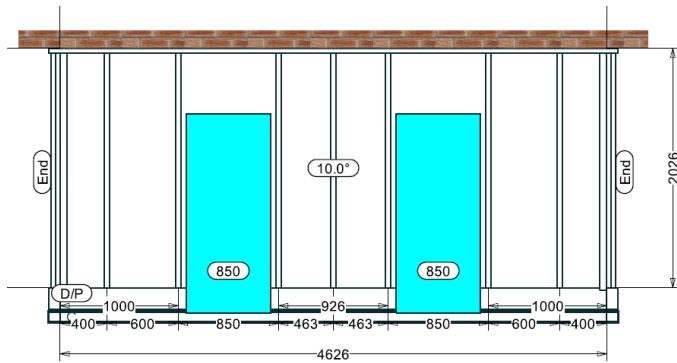
Design Access Statement

Site Address	Meridian Cottage, High Street, Damerham, Hampshire, SP6 3EU
List Description	Grade II listed although the conservatory is on the rear of the building which was built around 1970's
Existing Structure	The existing structure is a white UPVC framework windows built on brick dwarf walls. The roof is white UPVC with polycarbonate sheeting which has badly degraded and discoloured and now leaking against the house walls. The current roof panels have also become brittle with age so remedial work of some type is now required to maintain water tight integrity.



Proposed Solution	To remove the existing conservatory polycarbonate sheet roof and framework and replace this with a Supalite tiled roof system with black roof shingles and 2 in number "Vista" glass rooflight panels to allow light into the main house. Below are some photos showing the examples of black roof shingles and the "Vista" roof windows fitted to Supalite roofs

Access

Access to carry out the works is proposed to be down the side of the adjacent property into the car parking area at the rear of the property in order to minimize inconvenience on the narrow rural village road to the front of the property
