Dear Sir/Madam

I acknowledge receipt of your notification accepted on 15th April 2024 giving us notice that you propose to carry out the above described tree work.

Your application was registered as valid on 15 April 2024

As the tree(s) is/are located in a Conservation Area, we have six weeks from the date of your notice to consider the expediency of a tree preservation order. If by 27th May 2024 you do not hear from us, you may carry out the work as long as you do so within two years from the date of your notice and do no more work on the tree(s) than is set out in your notice. We will, however, aim to inform you of the Council's decision before this date.

While it is not a statutory requirement it is our policy to give local bodies and members of the public an opportunity to comment on conservation area notifications and we do this through our Public Access system, by informing local councillors and, in the case of proposed tree removals, writing to near neighbours asking for comments to be returned within 14 days. We also request that the appended Site Notice be displayed on receipt in a position prominent for the public to read.

An Arboricultural Officer will assess your proposal and during this process any comments we receive will be carefully considered.

The submission of applications/notifications, which include the Applicant's name and address, supporting documents and plans, forms part of the statutory register that local

authorities are obliged to maintain. Where the register is kept using electronic storage, the regulations allow for the register to be available for inspection by the public on a website.

PUBLICITY FOR TREE WORKS APPLICATIONS

Cambridge City Council is concerned to ensure that the owners and/or occupiers of adjoining properties and any member of the public who may be interested, are aware of all applications to carry out works to a protected tree and are allowed to make representations before the application is determined.

You are requested to date the site notice and display it on the site of the proposed works where it may be viewed by the public, for a period of not less than seven days. Please make sure that it is within a reading distance of the public footway. The Notice should be displayed as soon as possible.
