

Heritage Statement

Eadric House was constructed in 1856 as Almshouses for the poor. Now two dwellings, the building was listed grade II in October 1976, comprising of a single storey accommodation built of traditional flintwork with stone dressings in a Victorian Tudor design with four prominent stone-built chimney stacks(all now redundant).These chimney stacks were restored, with planning permission, in 2022. The windows at the front and sides are metal with a diagonal lattice pattern for the glass panes. Eadric House is a delightful building on the village green (aka the Egg), set in the picturesque landscape of the High Weald rolling countryside and adjacent the Parish Church, St Andrews.
