## 8 - Non-Material Amendment(s) Sought

## Please describe the non-material amendment(s) you are seeking to make

- 1 Change of type of wall and roof cladding on one of the buildings seen in Elevation D from corrugated metal cladding to European larch wood cladding on the walls
- 2 Change of colour of window frames to architectural bronze on the stone buildings and Graphite Grey RAL7024 on the larch clad building
- 3 Change of material from newly constructed stone faced wall to larch cladding in the single storey outbuilding seen on the West Facing wall of Elevation A for the portion of newly constructed wall inbetween and above the 2 sets of large windows.

## Please state why you wish to make this amendment

- We have bought the cladding and done everything we can to make it go rusty and (because it is all galvanised these days) we just cannot find a way to make it rust up as originally planned. Our builder and architect are both in agreement that the longevity of the approved material is questionable. We think that the larch cladding is an allround more suitable material.
- Whilst looking at non-domestic stone buildings around the county we have always favoured architectural bronze as a material for the windows but have been unable to afford this material. We have found a bespoke RAL colour which is very close. We think that this colour is more compatible with the stonework.

  The windows in the larch-clad building would have a different RAL colour of 7024: Graphite Grey (inline with the proposed standing seam roofing material)
- We have found it very difficult to source the right kind of stone, newly quarried stone looks too modern as it is not cut the same way. The original building didn't have any stonework along this elevation, it was a combination of glazing and timber. We therefore propose that the central part of this elevation be clad with the larch timber rather than stone
