Frequent complaints regarding the presence of skateboarders in public areas, attributed to the noise of their boards and the acrobatics they perform, these issues could be effectively mitigated through the provision of a suitable skatepark. It is noteworthy that a significant portion of skateboarders opt for locations such as car parks or the town centre due to their superior amenities, as opposed to the existing skatepark, which fails to meet requirements.

A new skatepark also has the potential to attract visitors from neighbouring areas, thereby stimulating local economic activity.
