Conditions/Reasons for refusal:

Evidence of a Bronze Age site was discovered during the excavation of a sand pit immediately west of the proposed development. The pottery, loom weight and metal items suggest a settlement and the metal items in particular might suggest a site of some status. Previous applications for conversion did not address archaeological matters as it was regarded that conversion of an existing building had limited archaeological implications.

In this case the development will replace the existing structure on site, and ground impact will be greater than the foot pint of the existing building. I also note from the photograph supplied that the concrete apron on which the building is stood appears to be 'built up' from the ground level not dug in, with an implication that if the Bronze Age settlement extends into the development site any cut features may well survive despite the previous development on site.

I recommend that an archaeological condition is attached to any planning permission which might be issued to secure an archaeological watching brief during the relevant stages of development, to ensure that archaeological remains encountered are recognised and recorded, and a report of those findings made.
