The branch is to close and therefore an external ATM and the bank signage are to be removed.

On the front elevation, the hanging projecting sign is to be removed, but the bracket is to remain for possible future use and to minimise disturbance to the heritage asset. The security camera is to be removed and the redundant wiring and fixing holes in the timber fascia are to be filled with wood filler. The fasci sign is to be removed and the redundant fixing holes in the timber fascia are to be filled with wood filler. The fascia and shopfront framing are to be repainted, white. The engraved text and logo on the letterbox face are to be carefully ground out. The through-the-window external ATM is to be removed and the aperture infilled with clear glazing. The over-ATM tablet sign and the under-ATM slip bin are to be removed. The blue film about the ATM is to be removed.

These proposed alterations are not considered to detract from the listed building appearance, character, and quality.

Lime mortar will be natural hydraulic lime (3.5) with a fine-sieved, crushed natural-stone aggregate to match the stone to be filled, and mixed in the ratio of 1 part lime: 3 parts aggregate, when filling redundant holes.
