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- T1, Sycamore Crown reduce and shape by 20% (4 metres) back to suitable pruning points.
- T2, Common Ash Section dismantle to ground level.
- T3, Sycamore Crown reduce by 15% (2.1 metres).
- T4, Goat Willow Section dismantle to ground level and treat the stump to prevent regrowth.
- T5, Crack Willow Prune back applicable growth away from the building to achieve a 2.5-metre clearance. Remove the eastern lopped branch back to the branch bark ridge.
- T6, Sour Cherry Prune back overhanging growth over the site boundary to suitable pruning points to achieve a 2-metre clearance.
- T7, Sour Cherry Crown reduce and shape by 15% (1.8 metres) to alleviate weight on the main union.
- T8, Sycamore Aerial inspection of the main union is required to determine if a cavity is present prior to any remedial work.
- T9, Sycamore Sever Ivy at the base of the tree, and re-inspect when the Ivy has died off.
- T10, Sycamore Section dismantle to ground level and treat stump to prevent regrowth.
- T11, Sycamore Sever Ivy at the base in order to reinspect the tree once the Ivy dies off.
- T12, Sycamore Sever Ivy at the base in order to reinspect the tree once the Ivy dies off.
- T13, Sycamore Section dismantle to ground level.
- T14, Sycamore Sever Ivy at the base in order to reinspect the tree once the Ivy dies off.

 - o marking all trees on the plan, but only numbering those to which you want to carry out work
 - showing the approximate distance between the application tree(s) and buildings
 - o adding other relevant features on the site (e.g. greenhouse, paths)
